I'm indeed honoured and humbled, to be given this rare occasion to stand before you to address this gathering this morning. Our country's favourable economic and political environments, pave the way for long term and sustainable partnerships between our two countries. This will also be made possible, by our progressive economic policies and incentive schemes.

Ladies and gentlemen, we continue to value you as a critical economic role player, hence we've come to knock on your door.
