As we prepare for this soccer showpiece, we know that the experience of today will eventually trigger positive responses among the nations that will be participating in that tournament.

The hosting of Miss World by the City of Johannesburg is indeed a major milestone in the consolidation of Global Confidence in the Brand South Africa.

It is also a significant opportunity for Mpumalanga to consolidate its brand awareness and communicate our promise to the world that world class tourism destination beckons in the province with a pioneering spirit and that everyone is welcome to experience scenic beauty and make contact with the origin of human life in Mpumalanga.

Ladies and gentleman, you are all welcome to the real place of birth - the land where the pioneering spirit reverberates throughout and the beating of the African drum signaling the start of another beautiful day in Mpumalanga.

If not please tell us. Today you were indeed closest to mother nature, an awesome experience. This is only 1 tenth of what you can experience here, so please come again, privately or otherwise.

Ladies and gentlemen, as a province we pride ourselves about good and excellent service, a service with a smile and a place where the safety of our guest is our number one priority. In the course of the next few weeks, my department and MTPA will look at the possibility of launching a customer service line that will give our people, our guest, a point of contact to report any services that are not in the spirit that we embraces as the province.

Ladies and gentlemen, tourism is one of the critical sectors that make significant contribution to the economy growth of the province. The sector has in many instances shown the potential to grow and continue to give us hope that it can lead our efforts to address the challenges of poverty and unemployment in the province.

Amid the current economic environment we have become known as a country that defies all odds among nations of the world. It is true that the number of tourists visiting South Africa grew by 188% since 1994, from 3 million to 8.4 million in 2006.

The number of inbound tourists rose in the first two quarters of the year that ended in September 2008 despite earlier forecast of decline in tourism demands by the UNWTO in its World Tourism Barometer (SAT Q1 2008). We have indeed become the country that defies all odds in the tourism market.

Ladies and gentlemen even when we make this observation we must indicate that the tourism sector needs such information that will help ensure that the business proposals and initiatives that we undertake are founded on sound knowledge and understanding of the current economic environment.

This is particularly important because the economies of the world are now experiencing huge challenges as a result of the global economic situation that hit the US. The so called sub-prime crisis is possibly the most serious economic shock the world has experienced over the past 20 years. This has meant bankruptcy and threatened foreclosure for a number of high profile and dominant financial institutions in the world economy, notably Bears Stearns and Lehman Brothers. Ladies and gentlemen, the crisis that started on Wall Street will have an effect on South Africa and indeed Mpumalanga because of our global connectiveness.

The effects of this financial challenges mean that we must re-look at everything that we do, satisfy ourselves that given this environment, whatever we are doing or plan to do is informed by careful consideration of the prospects of success of our tourism enterprises.

We believe the 102 Days quick wins campaign that the Mpumalanga Tourism and Parks Agency has embarked on will propel us to believe in our selves even more. We are glad that this gala dinner for Miss World contestants, which in many respects signifies the success of this campaign, is held here in the province.

Ladies and gentlemen, the hosting of this Gala Dinner confirms what we have said in our Policy and Budget speech earlier this year that there is a sweeping new wave of performance in the agency which we believe it will take the industry to greater heights. MTPA's partnership and joint marketing agreements with world renowned agencies, like Thompson Holidays, Johannesburg Tourism Company and others will see our industry continue on the upward trend that we are beginning to experience. The second quarter report on tourism arrivals since April 2008 which was released few days ago also confirms some of the assertions we made then.

We now know that more and more of our people from near and far places around the world travel to the province for holidays more than any other activity. We can offer even more.

Let me also thank Ms Lindiwe Mahlangu, the CEO of Johannesburg Tourism Company for allowing this part of the event to come to our province.

Ladies and gentlemen, we pride ourselves about the picturesque scenic beauty of our province which is blessed with some of South Africa's and the world's best tourist draw-cards; our game reserves, forests, hiking trails and beautiful rivers and mountains and fossils that tells a story of the early life on earth but a few. We know we can offer much more than that in terms of tourism offerings. When you come again we will have more to offer you.

Our vision to be 'your world class tourism destination" is supported by the accolades that the local tourism products and owners have received in recently, among these there is:

- Cycad Lodge and Chalets which was entered into the Wall of Fame after coming tops for three years in a row (2005/07) at the AA Travel Guides Awards. This year they won another awards at the Tourism Indaba.
- Singita Game Reserve which has won multiple global awards and recently voted the World Best Hotel just to Mention the few.

We are indeed the land of the endless possibilities because everything started here we are inspired by the pioneering spirit that reverberates in all of the people and tourism products owners in the province
