Ladies and gentlemen, in the most recent time Mpumalanga Tourism and Parks Agency hosted the Miss World contestants as a way to show that we are ready to welcome the world to our province.

Many of our tourism products and owners received accolades in recent time, an indication that within us lies a determination to make the province a jewel for the tourists.

And as we push for more business and leisure tourists to our province, we know that we are challenging our capacity to accommodate many people that we entice to the province.

It means that the expansion of the conferencing facilities in the provinces would have to be complemented by equal investment in number of beds to accommodate the large numbers of people that we wish to attract to use our facilities.

The fact that the country will be the playground for major international soccer matches this year and in 2010 means that there is justification for our confidence in the ability of the industry to help us overcome the effect of the economic meltdown.

The number of inbound tourists rose in the first two quarters of the year that ended in September 2008 despite earlier forecast of decline in tourism demands by the UNWTO in its World Tourism Barometer (SAT Q1 2008). This simply means that we have indeed become the country that defies all odds in the tourism market.

In conclusion let me take this opportunity to congratulates the visionaries behind the Inhlangano conference centre, you have done a marvelous work!

We are proud to be associated with the launch of the conference facility because you are helping us to become a great nation.
