


On this day, Mayisha Secondary School's ambience was improved to the delight of the entire community of the Dr JS Moroka Local Municipality.

This positive development necessitates that the Department acknowledges and appreciates the achievements of these officials, encourage its employees to further their studies and to further request their participation in the development agenda of the department.


