That you have chosen to be amongst us as we write the history books in bringing this state of the art school to the people of Alexandria Trust is an injection in the arm for the departments involved as well as the Bushbuckridge Local Municipality to be eager to deliver such services to other communities as well.

MATHIBELA HIGH SCHOOL

This school infrastructure comprises 18 classrooms, an Admin block, computer centre, science laboratory, school hall, kitchen, admission facilities and Sports facilities.

INFRASTRUCTURE IN BOHLABELA

There is a good story to tell in Bohlabela, Bushbuckridge with regards to the delivery of school infrastructure. As we handover this project, it gives me pleasure to inform you that we have already made a lot of strides in this municipality with regards to school infrastructure development. This is what we have covered;

TSAKANE SPECIAL SCHOOL

On 16 October 2014, we handed over Tsakane Special School in this local government. This project comprised of 10 Classrooms with supporting facilities, an Administration Block, Media Centre, School hall, 04 New Workshops, a Guard House, Fence, Water, Electricity, Garages and 2 Sports Grounds with 5 Toilets.

SAMUEL MHLANGA PRIMARY SCHOOL

The construction is near completion and the project comprises of 19 Classrooms, Grade R facilities, an Administration Block, a Laboratory, a Library, a Computer Centre, a Kitchen, a school hall, 28 Toilets, Three Sports Grounds and a car park.

MOSES MNISI SECONDARY SCHOOL

The project to substitutes 28 unsafe classrooms commenced on 25 March 2014. There is also an administration block, a laboratory, a Library, a Computer Centre, a School Hall, a Kitchen, 3 Sports Grounds and a Car Park. This project is also near completion and the learners have taken occupation of the classroom as teaching and learning is progressing well.

MPISANA PRIMARY SCHOOL

The project to demolish existing classrooms to construct 12 classrooms commenced on 01 March 2014. There are also 18 Toilets, an Admin Block, a Library, a Kitchen, a School Hall, a Computer Centre, ramps and rails, 03 Sports Grounds and a Car Park.

CHUEU PRIMARY SCHOOL

The existing 14 classrooms were demolished to pave way for the construction of 10 classrooms and 15 toilets, an Administration Block,

Fence, Library, Grade R Centre with four Toilets and a Fence, 3 Sports Grounds and a car Park. The project was completed in May 2014.

SABEKA PRIMARY SCHOOL

The Construction of 12 Classrooms, Grade R facilities, an Administration Block, a Library, a Computer Centre, 20 Toilets, Fence, Electricity, a Kitchen, Gate Security House and a Car Park.

MBHANDULE SCHOOL

The project comprises of Phase 1 of the addition and alterations project to construct 08 Classrooms, an Administration Block, Toilets, Fencing, a Guard House, Water and Electricity.

FRANK MAGHINYANE SECONDARY SCHOOL

The school comprises of 16 classrooms with a maths and science laboratory, computer centre, library, 24 toilets, administration block, and three sporting facilities for soccer, netball and a tennis court

SCHOOL SANITATION PROJECTS

In addition to the project, the Department of Education in partnership with the Department of Public Works Roads and Transport has completed school sanitary projects in Lehlasedi and Godide secondary schools.

TAKE GOOD CARE OF THE SCHOOL INFRASTRUCTURE

Alexandria Trust and Lehuke Circuit will no longer be the same again because the children will wholly benefit from being at school and as such all such social ills which were in one way or the other bedeviling this community resulting from the challenge of not having decent schools will cease to exist.

The children in this community will enjoy learning in a way that learner drop out will be a thing of the past, there will be improved learner performance and levels of motivation will be enhanced.

I reiterate this plea and urge members of this community to make an effort to ensure that all children of school going age attend schools and learn every day.

At the same time we must ensure that the furniture and property of the school remains protected from vandalism and theft. The hand over function states that the community takes ownership of the school.

Please take good care of this school as if it your own property meant to benefit your children and their children. Allow the school to be beautiful and new all the time so that it could be preserved for the future generations.

As a conclusion, let me once more take this time to extend our appreciation to Kgosi Mokoena for the visionary leadership he has shown over the years as he has demonstrated his love for education in the interest of the people of Alexandria Trust and the whole province.
