Those of you who have not yet started with studying for your secondary school exit should do so and be reminded that there is now no weekend or holiday for you as every day should be efficiently utilised for school work and studying to guarantee your success at the end of the year.

The province has managed a **76.8%** pass rate in the 2022 National Senior Certificate Examinations. Your district, Gert Sibande registered a **77.7%** pass rate which is an improvement of 5.5% to the **72.2%** pass rate obtained in 2021. This improvement places Gert Sibande on second spot of the performance chart out of the four education districts in the province.

This performance is appreciated as an upward mobility and we remain adamant and hopeful that you will improve on it hence our presence here today.

Congratulations are in order to you, District Director and your team in the district, circuits and schools for working so hard and smart in improving your results. We are hopeful that this upward trajectory will continue in your so that we may realise our 83% target for the 2023 national Senior Certificate Examinations.

In Gert Sibande District, the best performing circuit is Lekwa East Circuit which registered a **96.6%** pass rate while your circuit, Chief Albert Luthuli obtained number **14** out of **19** circuits with **77,5%** pass performance which is a regression of **0,9%** from the **78,4%** obtained in the 2021 National Senior Certificate examinations.

We are thus here to remind, inspire and pledge our support to you so that an upward trend could be developed and maintained.

As the Class of 2023, our dream and hopefully your dream is a 100% pass rate. We know that dreams do come true, especially if you work towards them. I invite you today to set a target for your selves to pass at the end of the year.

In this instance in the 2023 NSC examinations **Carolina Akademiese SKC** recorded a **97,1%** pass. There were **35** candidates who wrote and **34** passed with **28** Bachelors and **06** Diplomas.

In **Carolina Combined**, **57** candidates who wrote and **52** passed translating to an **91.2%** pass with **17** Bachelors, **30** Diplomas and **05** Higher Certificates.

In Violet Jiyane secondary school, 54 candidates wrote and 48 passed translating to an 88,9% pass with 20 Bachelors, 10 Diplomas and 18 Higher Certificates.

In **Zinikeleni**, **201** candidates wrote and **135** passed translating to an **67,2%** pass with **40** Bachelors, **52** Diplomas and **52** Higher Certificates.

Programme Director, in this province we have a culture of rewarding good performance and excellence, I hope you are aware that the 2022 overall best grade 12 learner from your district, Highveld Secondary School in Elukwatini obtained distinctions in all her subjects.

As such she was the overall best learner in quintile 1 schools in the country and the best of the best in Mpumalanga – the Place of the Rising Sun.

As a reward for her achievement, she has received, **R10 000.00** courtesy of SASOL, **R 15 000.00** courtesy of Standard Bank, **R 20 000.00** courtesy of ABSA,

R 15 000.00 courtesy of IDC, a tablet from Vodacom, a Power Bank and Bluetooth Headphone from Telkom as well as a Bar Fridge, Steam Iron and Travel Bag.

She also received a full bursary from the Mpumalanga Provincial Government that caters for tuition, accommodation, stationary, meals and a monthly stipend. She also received a brand new sponsored car.

Her name is **Bathobile Nkambule** who is the true personification of hard work at play.
