A reflection on the Circuit Results

Last year in 2022 Ehlanzeni registered **76.2%** and once more Mgwenya circuit scored below the district average, you registered **67.5%** which was an improvement from the **75.6%** obtained in 2021.

Programme Director, the Department has **71** circuits, and Mgwenya Circuit is standing at position **63**. Mgwenya Circuit also rates number **13** out of the **15** circuits in Ehlanzeni District.

We wish that this Circuit can be top in terms of performance, hence we are.

Let us therefore take a moment and reflect on how the schools in the circuit performed.

Mgwenya circuit has ten schools which administered the 2022 National Senior Certificate Examination.

Bonginhlanhla Secondary School had 90 learners who wrote the Examination and of those 76 passed, as such the school obtained an impressive 84.4% pass rate. Chief Charles Secondary School had 157 learners who wrote the Examination and of those 128 of those passed, as such the school obtained a commendable 81.5% pass rate.

Sidungeni Secondary School had **78** learners who wrote the examination and of those **59** of those passed, as such the school obtained an encouraging **75.6%** pass rate

Sitintile Secondary School had **214** learners who wrote the examination and of those **153** passed, as such the school obtained a hopeful **71.5%** pass rate.

Ncakini Secondary School had **204** learners who wrote the examination and of those **143** passed, as such the school achieved a **69.8%** pass rate.

Thembeka Secondary School had **114** learners who wrote the examination and of those **79** passed, as such the school registered a **69.3%** pass rate

Lekazi Secondary School had **173** learners who wrote the examination and of those **118** passed as such the school obtained a **68.2%** pass rate.

Khaliphani Secondary School had **172** learners who wrote the examination and of those **107** passed as such the school obtained a **62.2%** pass rate.

ZB Kunene Secondary School had **157** learners who wrote the examination and of those **82** passed as such the school registered a **52.2%** pass rate.

Mayibuye Secondary School had 171 learners who wrote the examination and of those 88 passed as such the school obtained just 51.5% pass rate.

We are deliberately presenting these results so that you can be aware of how your schools performed last year and for you to make a conscious decision to improve the results of your school this time around.

District Director, Circuit Manager, Principals, Teachers and Learners from Ngwenya Circuit, we are not daydreaming when we have so much expectations from you, we know what you are capable of.

In the year 2022, five of the Provincial Top Ten Learners were from the Ehlanzeni District, this is very commendable, it is unfortunate that none of these learners were from this circuit.

This is the reason why we can celebrate, Simelani Zwelihle, from Khutsalani Secondary School, who was part of the Top Ten, scoring level 07 in all his seven subjects.

For his excellent work he received a full bursary from the Department, a travelling Bag from Old Mutual, a Tablet from Vodacom, a solar power bank from Telkom, a Laptop from MTN, a Bar Fridge, Steam Iron, a Goodie bag from Fundi, a Bag Pack, USB and Water Bottle, R 15 000 from Standard Bank, R 20 000. 00 from ABSA, R10 000. 00 from SAICA and R 10 000.00 from SASOL.

My children, it is all in your hands.

Take the opportunity of the May/June examination to honestly push yourselves, use these examinations to measure just how evaluate yourselves.

All you need to do is to take a position and work smarted and harder than before –respect your teachers, pay attention to what they are telling you and walk an extra mile in your school work.

You must stop blaming your environment and others for your lack of focus and laziness but look at the positive side of things and make things work for you.

It is only you who must rise to the occasion in order to be continued amongst the best of the best.
